Message from......PETER JAMES - ACTING PRINCIPAL, BUNDOORA SECONDARY COLLEGE

As the school begins, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to the Bundoora Primary School and Secondary College communities. Sue Muscat is on leave until July and I have been appointed by the North-Western Victoria Region to sit in her stead for the first two terms of this year.

I have been an Assistant Principal at Lalor Secondary College for the past seven years, and prior to that, I was a Leading Teacher at Copperfield College in Melbourne's west for many years, after having begun my career teaching at Yarram High School in South Gippsland.

My role at Lalor S.C. centred on the management of school facilities and also leadership of the junior students in the school. Included in this was a particular responsibility for the transition of primary school students into the school and I have developed a great interest in what happens in our primary schools.

I spent a month at BSC towards the end of last year and I am aware of the teaching and curriculum changes underway at the school. I am particularly excited about the school's decision to provide a greater range of learning choices at years 8, 9, 10 and 11. This will give students a greater say over what they learn at school and perhaps more importantly, it will encourage students to engage responsibly and enthusiastically with the choices they make. In the brief time I was at Bundoora last year, I was impressed with the professional and caring approach of the teachers at the school and the willingness of the students and their families to embrace the new subject choices. I am confident the new subject electives will facilitate great learning and teaching at Bundoora in 2017 and beyond.

Before School / After School Care Program

(for bookings phone **0467 712 368**)



A reminder to all parents that our Out of School Hours Care Program operates each morning from 7.15am-8.45pm and from 3.15pm-6.00pm. The cost of our Before School Care Program is \$15.00 (less 50% CCB Government Rebate, then less CTR Rebate), and our After School Care Program is \$20.00 (less 50% CCB Government Rebate, then less CTR Rebate).

Most families are eligible for Child Care Benefit (CCB) and Child Care Tax Rebate (CCTR 50%), which makes our After School Care Program very affordable. The full fee (\$15.00 before school & \$20.00 after school) applies for families who do not apply for and are not eligible for CCB and the CCTR (50% Tax Rebate). We also offer a discounted charge for our international families (please see our office staff) who are not eligible for CCB/CCTR benefits.

To enrol your child in the Bundoora Primary School OSHClub, simply go to www.oshclub.com.au and enter your details online.

Once you have registered, you can book your child in our Before or After School Care Program by simply calling 0467 712 368. You can also use the OSHClub online service to make or cancel a booking (24 hours' notice required for all cancellations) via www.oshclub.com.au. Please do NOT call the school's number for bookings or cancellations.

A reminder to all parents, where possible, to provide as much notice (at least 24 hours is preferable) to book their child into our before and after school care program. Our OSHC Program is growing in success and popularity and we have been running the program, regularly on some days, close to our maximum licensed capacity. Also, a reminder that a late fee of \$2.00 per minute is charged when children are picked up from our OSHC Program after 6.00pm. It is a requirement that we are advised if, for whatever reason, parents will be running late and collecting their child after 6.00pm. 
