- A reminder that **school uniform orders are to be placed online through fcw.com.au**. Orders will be filled each Monday morning when our coordinator, Leonie McDonald, attends to the uniform orders between 9.30am-11.00am. I encourage parents to pre-empt the coming cooler weather, and order their child's school jumper or jacket prior to the end of term to ensure their uniform order is ready for the start of Term 2.
- A reminder for our office to be **updated with any contact details**, medical or at risk issues, if circumstances change. It can be very frustrating when attempting to contact a family member, with the number being disconnected or no longer in use. You can update your information by completing the eForm on our App or obtaining a form from our office.

Our staff have been using Compass for internal school purposes since last term and are very happy with its abilities and applications.

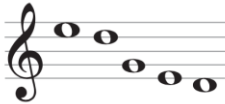

STEM NEWS:

This term Grades 1-6 are looking at Chemical Science. This has involved experiments about solids, liquids and gases, as well as looking at materials and the properties of those materials. Our learners are full of interesting questions about different areas of Chemical Science, and although we are unable to do any experiments that create explosions, we are having lots of fun with our hands on learning.

Our Prep learners have been exploring STEM by using our senses. We have discussed how to learn more about the world around us and to ask thoughtful questions and make scientific predictions.

Our 3/4 STEM club has been working on some solar machines, building and wiring them, then testing them in the sun.

In our 5/6 STEM club we quickly filled up all our spaces. This group of students have been coming to Bundoora Secondary College with Ms Jeffries and Mr Cass after school each Monday to do some exciting hands on activities. We started off with soldering, and then moved to creating our own circuits. 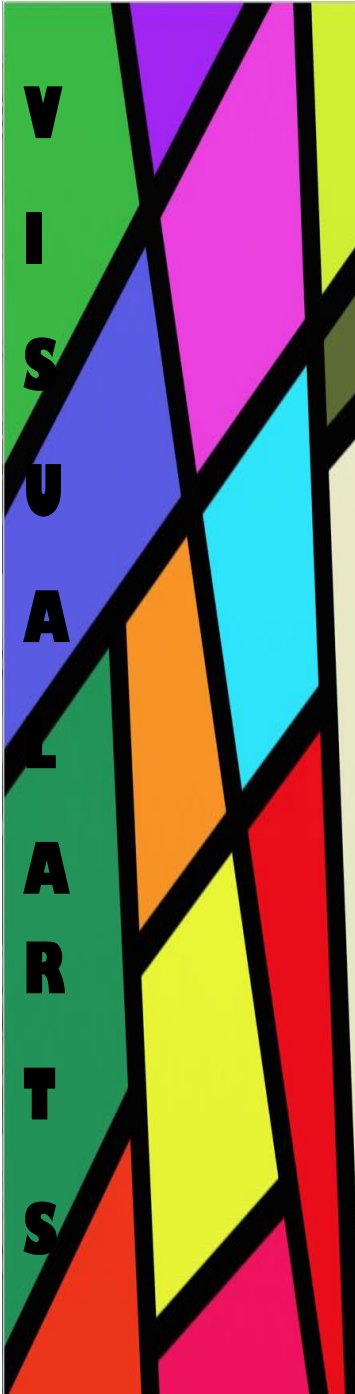

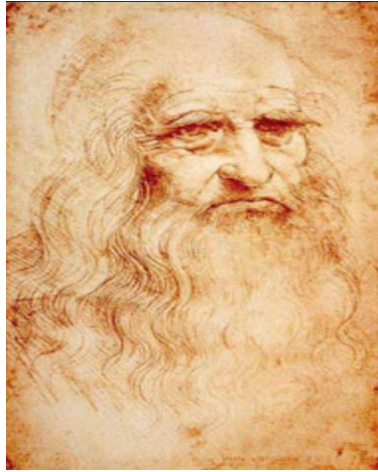
Visual Arts
