From the Principal...

Welcome to Term 4! Hopefully all of our students and families enjoyed the two week holiday break and had a chance to get out in the beautiful sunshine we were lucky to have. A reminder that during Term 4 all students must have a Bundoora Primary School hat, in line with our SunSmart policy. Hats, as with all uniform, are to be ordered through the fcw.com.au website. Please remember to remain updated with all the goings on in and around our school via our newsletter, our Class Rep emails, and our Compass messages.

Car Parking - Banyule Council Works

The disabled car park has now been completed, positioned on Bendoran Crescent (near Balmoral Avenue). In line with usual traffic laws, specific disabled stickers must be displayed when using this car park. The

"Kiss and Drop zone" has now been put in place along Bendoran Crescent between the "Parking 2 minute" signposts. This means parents are now able to park within this zone at drop off and pick up times for no more than 2 minutes to allow for children to get in or out of their cars quickly and safely. This will free up the traffic congestion around our school and eliminate the safety issues surrounding illegal double parking, etc.

Please observe all new parking requirements to avoid fines.

After vigorous discussions with School Council, consideration of all factors, and the recent resignation of our Coordinator, Laura, it was decided that our **Out of School Hours Care Program would be managed by a new service provider, TheirCare**. TheirCare is a company who have been involved in out of school hours care for many, many years, and bring a wealth of experience and knowledge, to develop our existing program. We have absolute confidence that TheirCare will run a caring, positive and professional program, sharing our school's vision of creating confident, creative and active citizens. TheirCare will manage all aspects of our Out of School Hours Program, including administration, payments, bookings, and parent enquiries and will officially take over the program from this Monday, 15th October. There is a parent information session tomorrow night, Thursday 11th October, at 6.00pm in the Palace, to provide information and answer any questions parents may have. The OSHC Coordinator, Adam Conybear, is working this week, with Laura, completing a thorough handover of our existing program. We hope also to be able to provide School Holiday Care next year.

Our **Social Enterprise World Hunger Evening is next Friday, 19th October**. This event is for Year 5 and 6 students and all parents in and outside of our community. Our Social Enterprise Committee have been working tirelessly throughout last term, and during these last holidays, to ensure the evening is a success. I encourage all parents to book their ticket via the trybooking site www.trybooking.com/XRQH (\$20.00 per person) to experience "Dinner in the Shoes of a Stranger". All monies raised will be donated to help support people experiencing homelessness in Melbourne. Please see the attached flyer for more information. The cut off for bookings has been extended to this Monday, so please get your ticket to ensure you don't miss this experience. To continue our Social Enterprise efforts to further develop our students' awareness of eliminating poverty, our whole school (all students & teaching staff) will participate in an **excursion to Bundoora Coles on Tuesday, 16th October**. The purpose of this excursion is to educate our students about what it is like for over 50% of the world's population to live on less than \$2 a day. This excursion will help them understand that not all food has to be expensive but with a little thought you can eat well for a small amount of money. Students will pool their \$1.25 (to be brought to school on the day) together in small groups, to buy a healthy lunch. From previous experiences with our seniors students, this

activity has proved to be extremely worthwhile. Please see Compass for more information about this excursion – consent only is required (not payment through Compass).

On Monday, 15th October, we begin the **“They’re Calling on You”** drive for the collection of old mobile phones and tablets, which raises funds to support Zoos Victoria and the Gorilla Doctors to care for wild gorillas. Over the holidays our Canteen building was demolished to make way for our new basketball court, which will be built this term. One more storage container will be delivered shortly to store school equipment.

Our new building is almost at lock up and is on target for completion at the end of the term. A new play space has been created in the old vegie garden at the Balmoral side of the Palace, to give our students some more play area. As well, a Gaga pit will be constructed for our students, which will be erected near the storage containers on the oval.

Stage 2 of building works are currently being planned to meet the \$2.7 million funding allocation. This building comes with specific criteria and we are obliged to meet space entitlement restrictions. Works will likely not commence until halfway through next year. We will continue to keep you updated with information as it comes to hand.

In preparation for our “Kiss and Drop” zone, Banyule Council has the following information for parents:

- *The drop-off and pick-up zone for the school will have ‘2-minute’ restriction, in the indented parking area off Bendoran Crescent (on the Bundoora Primary School side), operating on school days.*
- *Please use Greenwood Drive to access the ‘kiss and drop’ zone on the West side of Bendoran Crescent. It is not recommended to undertake ‘U-turns’ to access the ‘kiss and drop’ zone as this can cause safety concerns for pedestrians, particularly children and will be an impediment to traffic flow on Bendoran Crescent.*
- *It is not recommended that parents leave the vehicle while dropping or picking up children. It is essential that the cars are parked for a maximum of two minutes to make the ‘kiss and drop’ zone functional and effective.*
- *Please be mindful that it is an offence to:*
 - *Double park next to a legally parked vehicle – even for a short time or to drop off or pick up passengers.*
 - *Stop or park within a ‘No Stopping’ zone.*

We can all work together to ensure the safety of children, pedestrians and motorists around our streets and schools. Adults play a vital role leading by example and setting good road safety practices. You can help by obeying road rules and allowing enough time to drop off and pick up your child. Remember, children are both vulnerable and subject to acting on impulse.

Our next **Parents & Friends meeting will be this Monday, 15th October, at 7.00pm** in our Staff & Community Room. This meeting will be to make the final arrangements to our upcoming Disco, organise our Colour Run, and Family Christmas Carols Evening. We welcome all parents to this meeting and welcome your thoughts and suggestions.
