Goal 1	To improve literacy and numeracy outcomes for all students.
Target 1.1	By 2022 the proportion of students achieving at, above and below level will correspond with NAPLAN assessment and Victorian Curriculum teacher judgement data.
Target 1.2	By 2022 the percentage of students achieving in high and medium gains will increase from 75 per cent to 80 per cent in Reading.
Target 1.3	By 2022 the percentage of Year 5 students in the top two bands will increase from 12 per cent to 25 per cent in Writing.
