- *Girls who have participated in the Women in STEM initiative.*

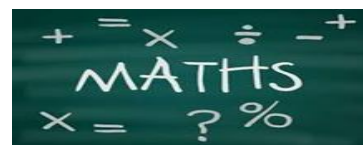

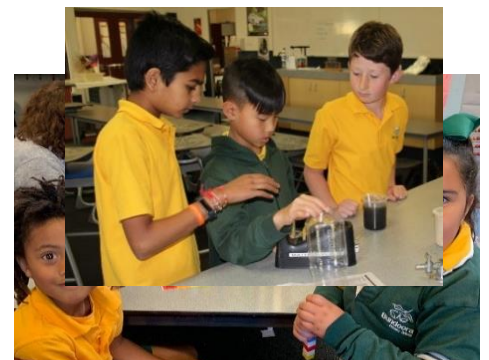
Maths Achievements
